**GOVERNMENT PLACES FLUE CURED TOBACCO PRODUCTION AT 777,475,000 POUNDS**

Indicated Figures are 7,260,000 lbs. Above the July 1 Forecast

Production of flue-cured tobacco is indicated at 777,475,000 lbs., by the Crop Reporting Board of the Department of Agriculture, compared with 682,850,000 pounds harvested last year.

The condition of this class of tobacco was 76 per cent of normal on August 1, as compared with 67 per cent on August 1 last year.

This indicated production of 777,475,000 of flue-cured tobacco is 54.9 per cent of the indicated total production of tobacco in the United States. The condition for the United States is reported as being 74.9 per cent of normal.

**Eastern North Carolina Production**

Production of Type 12 flue-cured tobacco is indicated at 288,604,000 pounds which exceeds all other types, except Type 31 which includes all of the light air-cured class.

The production of Type 12 flue-cured tobacco for the five year period, 1928-32, averaged 254,996,000 pounds.

Production of Types 11, 13 and 14 is indicated at 245,825,000 — 170,320,000 — 72,690,000 pounds respectively.

Growers received on an average of 22 cents per pound for their 1936 crop of all types of flue-cured tobacco, compared with 20 received for the 1936 crop.

Prices received for the 1935 crop of other classes of tobacco as follows:

**BORDER BELT MARKETS OPEN.**

The Border Tobacco Belt opened Tuesday. Governor Hoey was present and made an address at Whiteville where 10,000 people had gathered to see the golden weed change for cash. Growers were jubilant at opening prices of around on average of \$25.00. No tickets were turned and everybody seemed satisfied. Not only is the crop in the Old Belt good, but throughout the whole tobacco growing territory in North Carolina the crop is said to be above the average. A few farmers around Zebulon are carrying their first curings to Lumberton and other places in the Border Belt to get some needed cash.

**BIGGEST CROP EVER**

The cotton crop in the United States is expected to be the largest ever ginned. And that despite reduced acreage in the staple. Already 142,000 bales have been ginned. North Carolina's crop is estimated at more than a million bales if not seriously damaged between now
