A money budget saves money, so why shouldn't a time budget save time? The answer is—it does. This



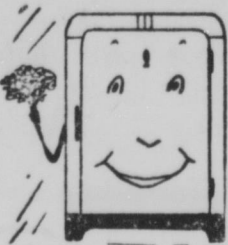
is the way to work it out. At the first of each week plan what you expect to accomplish that week; then divide that work into days and as each piece of work is done check it off your list. Among the virtues of this time budget is the way it saves one's nerves and disposition by making the work systematic.

PINEAPPLE CHIFFON PIE recipe for one 9-inch pie: Separate 4 eggs and beat yolks until thick and lemon-colored. Continue beating and gradually add 6 tablespoons of sugar. Place in top of double boiler and cook, stirring constantly until mixture is thick and creamy. Then remove from fire. Soak 1/2 tablespoon unflavored gelatin and 1 tablespoon canned pineapple juice for 5 minutes. Heat 5 tablespoons pineapple juice to the boiling point and add; stir until gelatin is dissolved. Then add dissolved gelatin and 1/4 teaspoon salt to egg yolk mixture and cool. Beat 4 egg whites until frothy. Add 6 tablespoons of sugar gradually and continue beating until stiff meringue is formed. Fold this meringue into the cooked mixture (cooled) and then add 1/2 cup crushed pineapple (drained.) Pour into baked pastry shell and place in the cold, properly moist atmosphere of the modern air-conditioned ice refrigerator to chill for four hours.



When making escalloped potatoes try using a can of cream of mushroom soup in place of part of the milk.

You can keep corsages about two weeks in summer and much longer in winter if after wearing them, you remove the ribbon, place the flowers in a shallow dish, cover the bottom with water, and then place them in a modern air-conditioned ice refrigerator. The vitalized air keeps them perfectly.



PEPPERMINT STICK ICE CREAM made the old-fashioned way in the new-fashioned ice cream freezers is a treat that calls for 3 loud cheers. These new freezers are so easy to operate, and make such velvety-smooth ice cream! Recipe: Soak 1 tablespoon gelatin in 1/2 cup milk. Heat 1 1/2 cups of milk and 1 pint whipping cream together and to this mixture add the gelatin. Stir until dissolved and then add 1 cup sugar and 2 beaten egg yolks. Blend carefully, remove from flame and add 1/4 teaspoon salt and 2 teaspoons vanilla extract. Pour mixture into freezing container of ice cream freezer and cover. Pack mixture of crushed ice and rock salt (use 3 parts ice to 1 part salt by volume) around the freezing container. Turn crank for about 5 minutes. Then take out dasher; fold in 1/2 cup of crushed peppermint candy, and pack down evenly with a spoon. Cover ice cream with wax paper and replace cover. Repack. Cover and allow to harden at least 1 hour before serving.

To pacify a balky bureau drawer that sticks and requires yanking and pulling, just rub the lower edge of the drawer with paste floor-wax. It will then open and close easily.

Keeping an active baby's high chair from tipping over is often a real problem. However, the problem can be easily solved by placing a screen door hook on the back of the chair and a screw-eye in the woodwork. Slip the hook into the screw-eye and the baby can play to his heart's content—and be safe.
