afford to add this extra advantage, which will greatly increase the facilities of our own school and greatly increase the advantages that our own children can get here at home.

Some of the citizens in the community who have discussed this plan think that it is the greatest step the community has ever taken along the line of school advantages. We believe all of you will see this in the same light that those who have the responsibility of shaping the school policies see it, and if you do we shall have no trouble in uniting our efforts for securing this extra advantage for the children of this community.

We are working solely for the twelfth grade, with the advantages it can offer, rather than for a ninth month. In a farming community the twelfth grade seems to be more advantageous than a ninth month.

The tax rate in Wake County is now seventy-five cents on the hundred dollars valuation, one of the lowest rates of similar counties in the State. The fifteen cent special tax now submitted would only make a ninety cents rate, which would still be one of the lowest rates in the State.

The election will be held Saturday, May 21st, 1938, with the registration book being open on Saturday, April 16th, 23rd, 30th,

and May 7th from 9 o'clock A. M. until 7 o'clock P. M. Saturday, May 14th, which is challenge day, the Registrar will be at the polling place at Wakelon School from 9 o'clock A. M. to 3 o'clock P. M.

This being a special election everybody must register in order to vote.
