A 400-pound per acre application of 3-8-4 fertilizer applied to rye by James Robertson of Bladen County resulted in the rye being thicker, taller, and with larger heads better filled with grain as compared with the check plot where no fertilizer was used.

Prepare for alfalfa early in the summer and be sure that the soil receives an adequate treatment of ground limestone to insure successful growth.

George Lathan has been declared the champion wheat grower of Union County with a yield of 58 bushels per acre. He turned under a heavy crop of cowpeas and used 500 pounds 16 per cent superphosphate per acre in preparing his land for the wheat.

By terracing his land and beginning a system of crop rotation, Landon Rosser of Mt. Vernon Springs, route 1, Chatham County, said he changed his farm operations from a losing business to a profitable enterprise.


