Mrs. J. C. Massey is spending a few days with her mother Mrs. Simon Alford of near Rolesville.

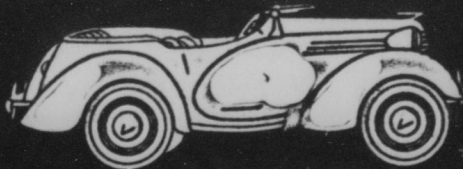
