Banker Vance Brown brought a New York Times article into the Record office the other day which stated that of the \$21,326,770,000 owed for Liberty Bonds from World War I about twenty-one million dollars is still outstanding.

These bonds now draw no interest, but may be cashed for their initial value plus interest up till the date of their maturity. Owners may receive money or War Bonds for their old bonds and interest.
