# **Oxford Points** To Orphanage Record

### 5,000 Children Trained By Pioneer Institution In Social Welfare Work

Oxford, North Carolina, has a Winston-Salem and Raleigh. record of sixty-nine years of service to the children of North Carolina. Over 5,000 have been cared for and trained. Its graduates and former pupils are in all walks of life and there is no record of a former pupil having been convicted and sentenced for committing a major crime. It is the oldest orphanage in the State and receives children other than those of the members of the supporting order.

At the present time less than 50 per cent of the population of the Orphanage is of Masonic parentage. The Home possesses valuable buildings, grounds and equipment and has had no operating deficit for several years.

The annual budget of the Orphanage calls for an expenditure of \$170,000.00. This provides shelter, clothing, food, recreation, heat, light, books, school supplies, health program, staff of trained workers, vocational training in several departments, laundry, repairs and upkeep to buildings, grounds and equipment ,and experienced case work for a family of 313 children.
