Dr. J. H. Ihrie of Wendell died Saturday afternoon at 4:45 at his home after an illness of two years. He was 74 years old.

The funeral services were conducted at the Wendell Methodist Church at 11 o'clock Monday morning and burial followed in the Episcopal Church cemetery at Pittsboro at 3 p.m.

Dr. Ihrie had practiced dentistry in Wendell since 1914. His first wife was Miss Margaret Strange of Atlanta, Ga., and of this union four children were born: John Haughton Ihrie, Jr., of Zebulon, R. R. Ihrie, H. R. Ihrie and Mrs. Jim Coley, all of Wendell. His second wife was Miss Hattie Moore Ihrie, and she survives him, along with one daughter, Mrs. Joe Palmer of Wilson. Fourteen grandchildren also survive.

Dr. Ihrie was a member of the Wendell Methodist Church for 25 years. The Rev. C. E. Vale, pastor, assisted by the Rev. C. W. Teague of the Wendell Baptist Church, conducted the services.

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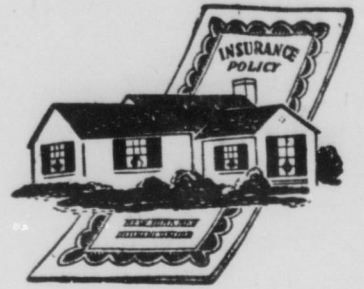
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The South is honored. It has been chosen as the place where thousands of returning heroes will first set foot on their native soil.
