In wisdom not from man Solomon said: "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep His commandments: for this is the whole du-

ty of man." The solution of our every problem has its beginning in these words, and ends with the Golden Rule.

A man 65 years old gets \$24.83 Social Security per month from the U. S. Government. Some states supplement this. A 65-year-old woman gets \$19.83. But if one earns more than \$14.99 per month he forfeits his government check. So with wages running from 75 cents to \$2.00 per hour men workers prefer keeping at it rather than retiring. When we come to earning 75 cents a day instead of an hour as in the great depression, a lot of the young fellows will be impatiently waiting for the turn of 65.

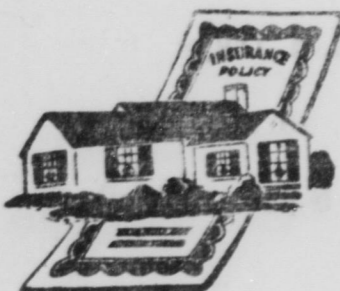
