#### UP POLITICS WARM

Zebulon's political campaign, which got off to a slow start last month, has turned out to be the most interesting in years, with all offices being strongly contested.

Mayor Avon Privett, in an advertisement in today's Record, asked the people to return him and the four incumbent commissioners to office, basing his plea on the financial record made in refinancing the town debt.

Opponents of the present administration cite the work done by Wallace Chamblee during his term as mayor, Foster Finch when he was commissioner, and preliminary work done by R. H. Bridgers with the Local Government Commission as being the foundation of the refinancing move.

They also point out the poor condition of the firefighting equipment, the state of repair of city streets, despite the availability of a road machine, and the lack of civic planning as evidence of the need for a change.

The administration replies that funds are on hand for needed improvements, and will be spent at the proper time. They stress the sound financial condition of the town.

Privett and Bridgers both have been working for themselves this week, as have most of the nine candidates for the five places on the board of commissioners. The heaviest vote in years is indicated, with a new registration of over 160 names.

Voting hours next Monday will be from sunrise to sunset, with Mrs. Vance Brown as registrar and Zollie Culpepper and J. A. Braswell as judges.
