DRIVER'S EXAMINATIONS

All operators of motor vehicles are required by North Carolina State Law to have their licenses renewed according to a schedule set up by the 1947 Legislature.

All drivers whose names begin in A or B may have their licenses renewed by passing a driver's test given by Clarence Hocutt of Zebulon, examiner for this area.

Hocutt will be at the town office in Zebulon each Monday and Tuesday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and again Saturday morning from 9:00 to 12:00. He will be at the Wendell town office on each Wednesday and Thursday, and in Spring Hope on Fridays from 9:00 to 5:00.

First Deep Well Proves Success; Work on Second Now Going On

Zebulon's first deep well has been completed by Heater Well Company, and is ready for use by the town except for installation last week, when Sidney Eddins of a pump and connection to the water main on Sycamore street.
