The Wendell Tobacco Market took a step forward Wednesday morning in its fight to obtain a second set of buyers from all the major companies when the American Tobacco Company placed additional buyers on the warehouse floors. With American taking the lead, other large companies are expected to follow, stated Philip Whitley, president of the Wendell Chamber of Commerce.

Independent buyers and smaller companies have purchased tobacco on both sales on the Wendell market ever since a second set of government graders was stationed there two weeks ago.

The Governor's talk was recorded, having been made Thursday morning in the governor's office especially for the Wendell-Zebulon post, and recorded by Barrie
