

Occonechee Council Sets 1947 Goal At Over \$46,000 for Boy Scouts

Plans for raising the 1948 operating budget of the Occonechee Council were completed at a meeting of the Occonechee Campaign Committee held last night in Raleigh, it is announced today by Dr. R. O. Humphrey, Sanford, campaign chairman.

The campaign in the non-Chest towns will be conducted simultaneously. Scouting in Zebulon is part of the Community Chest, but the other eight districts will be conducting strictly scout campaigns.

A campaign schedule was adopted at the meeting, which will end November 21. During that time each district will raise its

share toward the 1948 budget, which is \$46,666.00. "The 1948 budget is the largest in the history of the Occonechee Council," it is pointed out by Hugh G. Isley, president of the Council, "but due

the Occonechee Council there would be no scouting. Budget items necessary for the operating of a council include advancement activities, office rent, telephone &

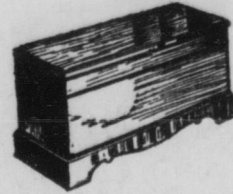
telegraph, leadership training, executive salaries, office salaries, field expense, postage, office supplies, equipment, insurance, audit, and committee work.
