 curing enough foundation seed each year to multiply and redistribute to cotton producers.
 During 1947, Wake County produced 5,614 bales of cotton as compared with 4,995 bales in 1946. During 1947 the ginners, fertilizer

dealers, seed crushers, and others cooperated with County Agent J. L. Reitzel in making producers aware of the advantages of following better cultural and marketing practices in cotton.
 Numerous educational meetings were held and individuals were encouraged to participate in the 5-acre cotton contest and 4-H Club projects. A county ginners organization was formed. The cotton samples submitted to the U. S. Department of Agriculture for classification showed an improvement in grade over previous years.


