

Let's Try Something New

Salads have grown in importance from "occasional" to "everyday," from "maybe" to "must." And Spring and Summer make them even more of a "must." They pep up what otherwise may be a dull, uninteresting meal. The most attractive salads are remarkable for their simplicity. Salads should taste as good as they look. Ingredients should be uniform in size and large enough to retain their identity. There will be more appetite appeal if the arrangement of the salad is casual instead of fixed. Toss ingredients slightly for arrangement on lettuce — never stir.

For a change try preparing a salad that may be prepared ahead of time. Serve a salad that is a meal in itself. The tang of the sea is what you will find in these two salads.

Tuna Tange

- 1 envelope of plain gelatine
- ¼ c. cold water

- ¾ c. hot water
 - 1 T. lemon juice
 - ½ t. paprika
 - ¾ cup canned tuna, flaked.
 - ¼ cup celery
 - ¼ cup sweet pickle or diced cucumber
 - 1 t. salt
- Soften gelatin in cold water. Add water stir until dissolved. Add salt, lemon juice, and paprika. Cool until mixture begins to congeal; mix in other ingredients. Pour into oiled moulds and chill in refrigerator until firm. Unmold on lettuce and serve with mayonnaise or salad dressing. Then your cold delicious summer meal is ready, full of the protein and minerals

you need to keep yourself feeling fit.

- Six servings.
 - Banana Salmon Salad**
 - 1 cup diced ripe bananas (one or two bananas)
 - ½ cup diced pineapple
 - 1½ cups flaked salmon
 - ½ cup diced celery
 - 2 T. finely chopped pickles
 - 1½ t. salt
 - 1 T. prepared mustard
 - 1 T. mayonnaise
 - Salad greens
- Combine bananas and pineapple. Add salmon, celery, pickles and salt. Add mustard and mayonnaise. Mix lightly. Serve on crisp lettuce cup or with other greens. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

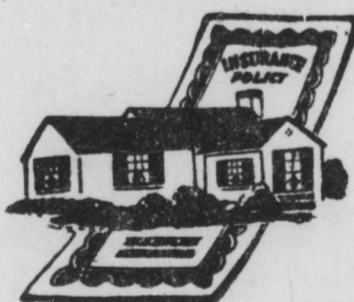
