The building which will house the gin is 30x80 feet and about 25 feet high. The walls are concrete block, and steel beams support the roof. It is as fireproof as can be made, said the builders.

Trucks will drive up to the side of the building and the gin will take the cotton and deliver it in bales at the front of the building for pick-up by the same trucks

Storage bins are planned for growers who do not have time to wait their turn in line when work is rushed. The operators said they will be able to nandle all the cotton grown in this area, and so expect few days when a delay will be necessary for those who come to have their cotton ginned.

Last year plans were made for purchasing a mechanical cotton picker for this section of the state, but they failed for a number of reasons-one of them being lack of a gin with facilities for handling machine picked cotton. Dave said that he was assured of two mechanical pickers for use here this year, so farmers wil be able to have their cotton picked cheaply and quickly.

With the new methods of picking and ginning cotton, the crop is expected to make a bid for its old supremacy in the south, and local farmers, with a cut in tobacco acreage a reality, are looking at cotton with new interest.
