FIRE SATURDAY

Fire broke out in the upstairs of the Ellis apartment house in north-east Zebulon late Saturday night and burned over the second floor before volunteer firemen, using the new truck and equipment for the first time, could bring the blaze under control. The cause of the fire is not known.

After some difficulty in connecting the hydrant to the pumping equipment, the firemen began to fight the blaze. Although the water pressure in the mains was low, the boost pump on the truck provided more than enough pressure.

Hose was stretched over 800-ft. to reach the fire, and two lengths of old hose were necessary. One of these lengths burst because of the high water pressure and had to be replaced.

The new truck was given credit for saving the house from complete destruction, and the volunteer firemen were praised for the work they did under extreme difficulties.

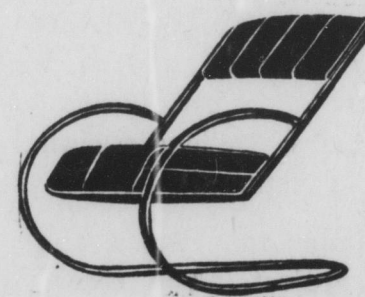
