CIVIL RIGHTS—North Carolina was the only Southern State which did not vote solidly against Harry S. Truman at the Democratic National Convention. Before, during, and following the convention you heard a lot of talk about civil rights, with the South kicking up its heels each time the issue was mentioned. Not since the Civil War has the South done such wholesale hell-raising over the race question...or any other question, as for that. Now you have heard about that terrible, terrible plank in the Democratic platform, that plank which is causing the Democratic Party to split at the seams. Have you ever read it? Here it is: "The Democratic Party is responsible for the great civil rights gains made in recent years in eliminating unfair and illegal discrimination based on race, creed or color."

"The Democratic Party commits itself to continuing its efforts to eradicate all racial, religious and economic discriminations.

"We again state our belief that racial and religious minorities must have the right to live, the right to work, the right to vote, the full and equal protection of the laws, on a basis of equality with all citizens as guaranteed by the constitution.

"We highly commend President Harry Truman for his courageous stand on the issue of civil rights.

"We call upon the Congress to support our President in guaranteeing these basic and fundamental rights: (1) the right of full and equal political participation, (2) the right to equal opportunity of employment, (3) the right of security of person, (4) and the right of equal treatment in the service and defense of our nation."
