(Continued from Page 1) above 400 degrees, doing the baking on "pre-heat." This is fine for Roller Champion, but I found that Gold Medal wants a heated oven to begin with, and more kneading of the dough. It was a relief to find the fault was in my method, not in the flour.

Have you ever tried using buttermilk in making yeast rolls?

Until recently I had not; but they are delicious. Do not heat the buttermilk, but otherwise proceed as when using sweet milk. The rolls will keep soft longer than when sweet milk is used, and warm over most satisfactorily.

The youngest son has one of those wire recorder machines, and not long ago he made a recording of one of our pastor's sermons with music and all the morning service. It sounded good, especially Nellie Kemp's solo. I knew the recording was being done and was much interested.
