Strong Wakelon Eleven Crushes Wendell, 24-6

The Wakelon Bulldogs, using their new deceptive T formation to advantage, trampled Wendell, 24-6, in a thrilling game played on the Wendell field Friday afternoon. Coach Jacob Smith's outfit was led by quarterback Bobby Bridgers and halfback J. C. Liles in its first game of 11-man football since pre-war years.

Wakelon put its power to work early when Mangum returned the opening kickoff 40 yards to the Wendell 25 yard line. Three line plays netted five yards to the twenty, where Bridgers faded back and passed to Mangum for the first touchdown. The kick for the point was wide and Wakelon led after four minutes, 6-0.

Joseph Passes for Score

Joe Joseph carried the attack for Wendell as they pushed across for a score without losing the ball after Wakelon had kicked off. From the Wakelon 48 Joseph made a first down on the Wakelon 35. Three more runs by the elusive Joseph placed the ball on the Wakelon five, where he passed to Hubert Pittman to tie up the score. He was stopped at the line of scrimmage on the try for extra point.

Wakelon's second score came after a sustained march from their own 29 yard line following the kickoff. A pass from Bridgers to Liles put the ball on the Wakelon 32. Greene picked up two yards and another Bridgers to Liles pass was good for 27 yards to the Wendell 39. Lloyd made three, and Bridgers, on a quarterback sneak, made a first down on the Wendell 26. Greene picked up one yard, and then Bridgers passed 25 yards to Brantley for the score. The pass for the extra point was batted down and Wakelon led, 12-6.

Second Half Opportunity

Wakelon missed a scoring opportunity early in the second half when Joseph made a bad punt from his 29, which was returned to the Wendell 31. Bridgers passed to Liles on the Wendell 19, and another pass took it to the 14. Bridgers bucked through to the 12, and fullback Jimmy Greene made a first down on the Wendell 8 yard line. An offside penalty set the ball back to the 12, but Greene bulled up to the 8 after a pass was no good. On las down, Bridgers ran around right end to the one yard line before being hauled down.

Led by versatile Joe Joseph, Wendell carried the ball from the

one to their own 40 yard line where they were forced to punt, and the punt was returned ten yards to the Wakelon 44. J. C. Liles ran wide around left end to the Wendell 44 for a first down. Bridgers passed to Robert Kitchings for another first down on the Wendell 21, but Wakelon lost the ball on downs as the third quarter ended.

Fumble Sets Up Score

From the 19, Joseph broke away for a 24 yard run around end to the Wendell 45, where he fumbled as he was tackled. The ball was recovered by Wakelon. Brantley picked up 8 yards and Bridgers made a first down on the 32. On fourth down J. C. Liles ran 12 yards to the Wendell 18. He took a pass on the 12, and in two tries Bridgers pushed to the Wendell five for a first down. Brantley ran to the three. Privette shifted from center to the backfield at fullback, and Brantley changed from end to snap the ball for the touchdown play, which baffled Wendell completely as Liles ran around left end to score standing up.

Privette Scores from Center

The final Wakelon touchdown came when Dan Privette broke through to block a Wendell punt on the Wendell 35 yard line, recovering the ball to run for the score. The run for the extra point was smothered, and Wakelon won the game, 24-6.

In first downs Wakelon led 9 to 4, which is a good indication of the comparative strength of the teams. For Wakelon, Bridgers turned in a good game at quarterback, and halfback J. C. Liles proved to be the fastest man on the team as he picked up yardage on wide end runs. In the line, which stood up beautifully in protecting the passer and screening the T, big Dan Privette led the way on offense and defense at center.
