

# Used Shoes to Be Sent To European Children

An intensive collection campaign will be carried on by Zebulon Boy Scouts tomorrow in an effort to help Wake County Boy Scouts collect 10,000 or more pairs of usable shoes to be sent to needy children in devastated Europe.

Children in Europe have been unable to attend school this winter because of the lack of shoes during the terribly cold weather of the severe winter months.

The scarcity of shoes in much of Germany is so acute that frequent-

ly there will be only one pair of shoes to a family of children and they are forced to take turn about going out.

Any kind of shoes, from baby shoes to shoes for grown-ups, will be acceptable. The heavier types that will best stand cold weather are, of course, more desirable.

Anyone having shoes which can be sent to aid the European children is asked to telephone 4231, and leave word with Scoutmaster Barrie Davis. Scouts of Troop 40 will pick the shoes up.
