New Ordinance

An ordinance prohibiting waton shooting of air rifles and guns is being publicized in an advertisement in this week's Record. The new law, passed at the December meeting of the Board of Commissioners, makes it unlawful for a gun to be fired inside the city limits off the premises of the owner, and then only after adequate precautions and taken to safeguard life and property.

The action was taken after the commissioners viewed with alarm the wars staged by young boys using airrifles as weapons. Several tragedies were barely averted as boys were hit on the face by the flying shot, and windows in buildings were broken during the outlaws.

For any one convicted of violating the new ordinance, the punishment is severe: \$5.00 fine and 30 days on the roads or both for each offense.
