We are sorry that Mr. Kelly Williams is sick. We hope he will soon be well and out again.

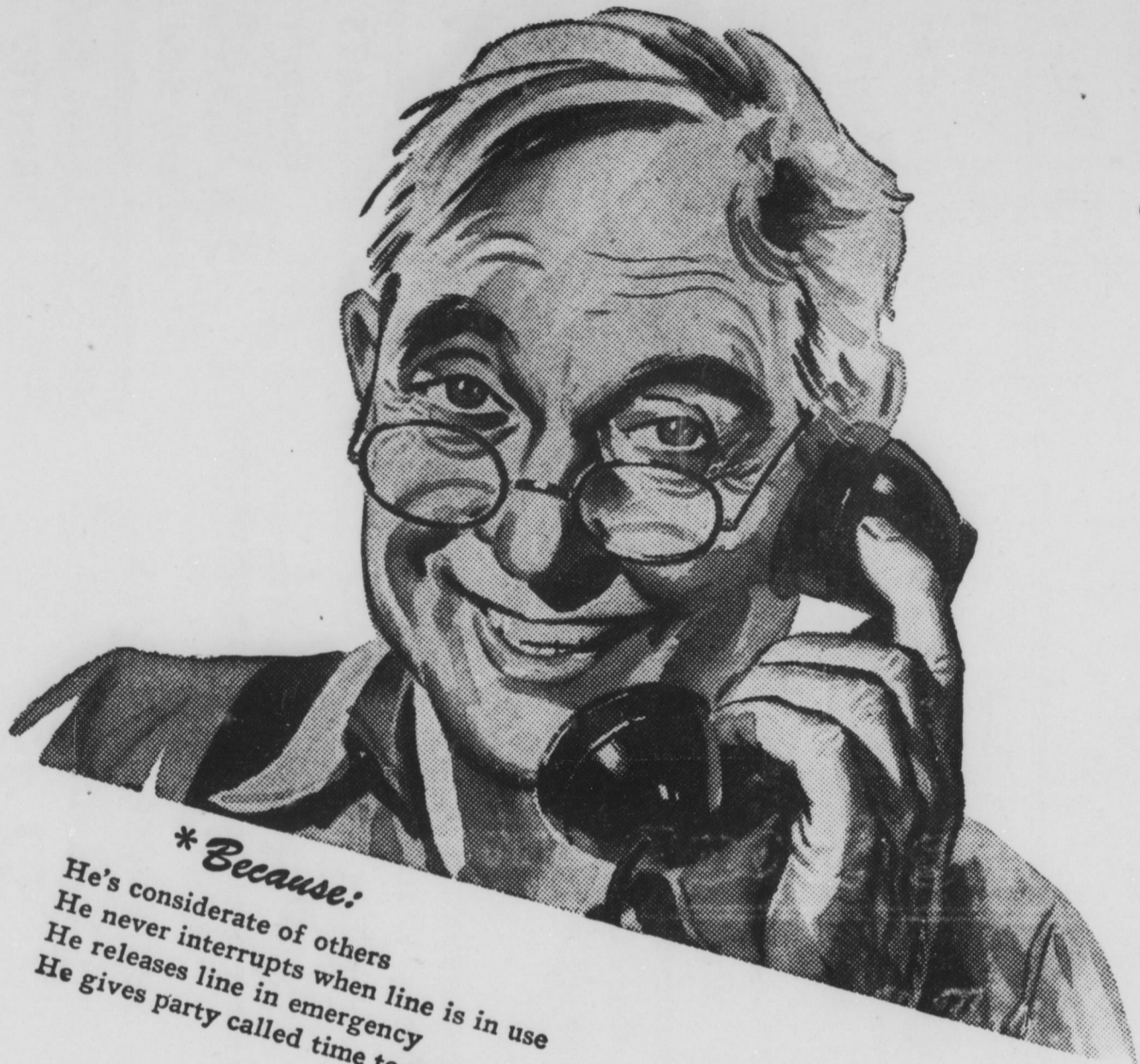
Regular church services will be held.
