times as much lime.)
On the fourth day drain the cucumbers again and replace in the container. From one gallon of water remove one cupful and replace with a cupful of good vinegar. Bring this to a boil and pour the pickles. Repeat the process on the fifth, sixth and seventh days. Note that you reheat the liquid these days, letting it come to a good boil and adding vinegar to make up what evaporate.
On the eighth day put the pickles into glass jars. Make a sirup of

vinegar, sugar and spices to suit your taste, pour it boiling into the jars, filling them almost to the top. Seal and store. Or, if you really enjoy heating and pouring, drain off your sirup another morning or two, bring it to a boil and pour it back over the cucumbers. By the tenth day you'll have things under control so that the pickles will keep for weeks without being sealed or refrigerated.
And you can make changes in flavor by putting crushed cherry leaves or grape leaves with the cucumbers for the first few days. This also helps keep them under the liquid.

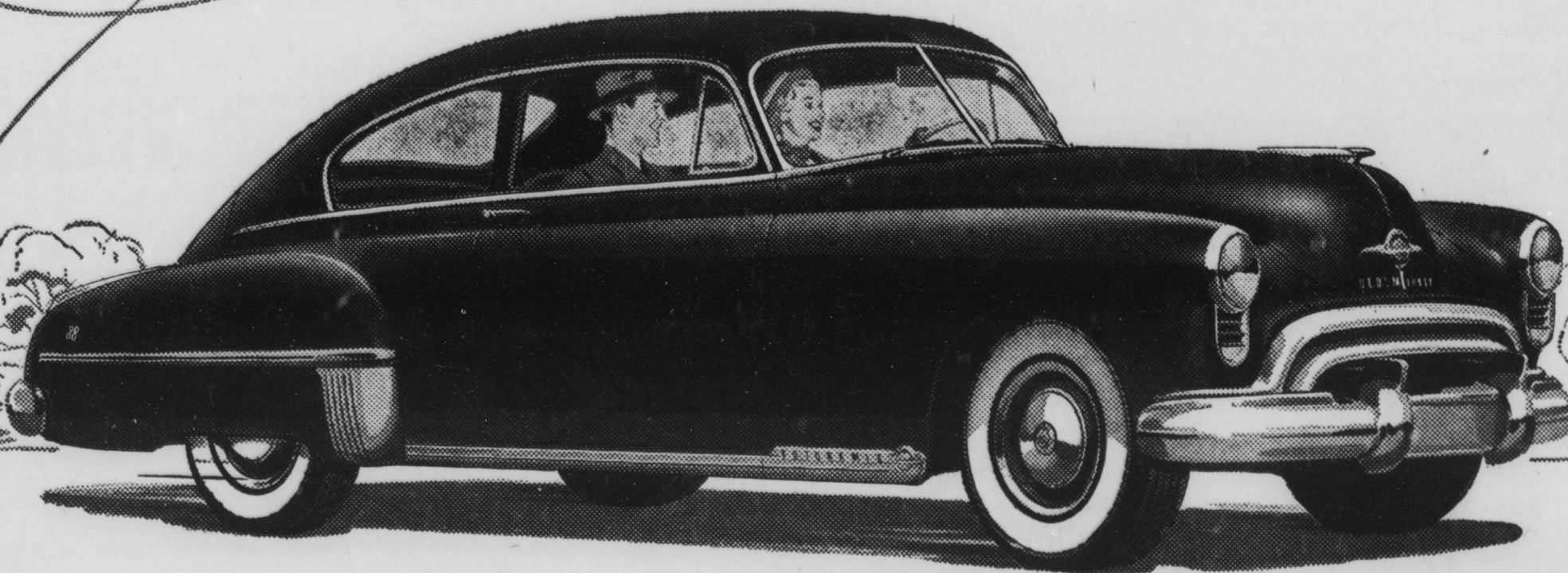
