

Cancer Diagnostic Clinic Examines Thirty-Two People

33 persons were examined in the Cancer Detection Diagnostic Clinics yesterday, when the clinics were held for the 8th time at the local Board of Health.

A total of 35 persons called at the Clinics, and priorities were issued to those that could not be taken at that time. These priorities were issued to these persons and distributed over several future clinics so that they will not return enmasse and block the next two clinics. Additional persons can be cared for at each succeed-

Two Need Treatment

The 33 persons examined consisted of: 4 white men, 24 white women, 3 negro women, and 2 negro men. Only 2 of the examinees had been referred to the clinic by a physician. Persons examined represented Rocky Mount and outlying areas, Greenville, Zebulon, Whitakers, Nashville, Elm City, Bailey, Enfield, Louisburg, Wilson, Warrenton Hobgood, and Plymouth.


