The R. A.'s, G. A.'s, and Sunbeams will meet at the church Friday night, April 28th. Remember this date also.

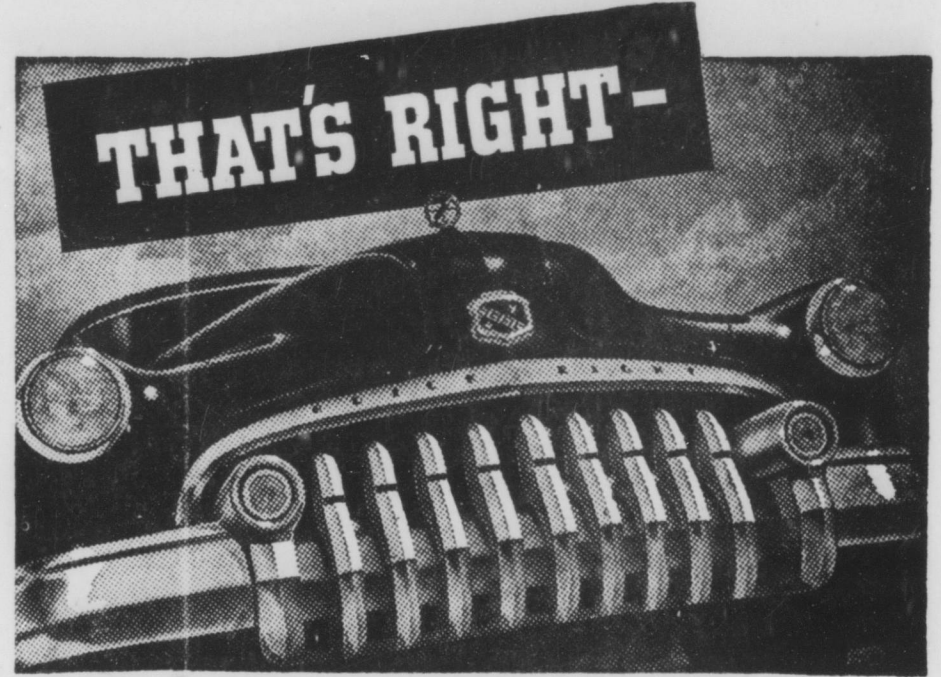
