## Armed Forces Day to Be Celebrated Here May 20

Mayor R. H. Bridgers proclaimed yesterday that Saturday, May 20, has been set aside as Armed Forces Day in Zebulon, as well as the rest of the United States, and the occasion will be marked with a display and exhibition by the local National Guard battery. The mayor stated that the proclamation was passed by the Board of Commissioners at their meeting Monday night.

Armed Forces Day replaces the separate birthdays celebrated by the Army, Navy, Marine and Air Force in previous years. It was initiated to help with the unification program now in effect.

Capt. Barrie Davis announced preliminary plans for the National Guard exhibit, which will be supervised by members of Battery A, 113 Field Artillery Battalion.

The howitzer demonstration, under the direction of First Sergeant Sidney Holmes, is expected to be the center of interest. A firing section will work a problem under his orders, and, although live ammunition will not be used, spectators can gain a knowledge of the training required for this work.

SFC Percy Parrish, battery mess

sergeant, will set up a field range with Pfc. Ray Gainey and Pvt. George Massey assisting. Pfc. Dave Finch will set up pup tents which will be used by the battery at Camp Butner next month.

Cpl. Wesley Pearce and another member of the communications section will demonstrate the hand-talkie radios, and if it is received in time, the BC610 radio which is mounted on the jeep, will be demonstrated.

Three telephones and a switchboard will be placed in operation by Cpl. John Clark and the wire section. Pfc. Kenneth Chamblee will be switchboard operator.

Carbines and .45 automatic pistols will be explained by SFC Carl Kemp. Sgt. Gordon Temple, chief of the ammunition section, will explain the machine guns.

The equipment will be set up about 1:30 in the afternoon, and the exhibit will last for about two hours.

## Brother of Zebulon Woman Loses Life in Crash of Bombing Aircraft

Staff Sgt. Jim Allen of Nashville, brother of Mrs. R. L. Hagwood of Zebulon, was instantly killed in the crash of a B-25 North American bombing plane in southern Illinois last week.

Sergeant Allen, who was flying as a regular crew member on the bomber, was based at Perrin Field, Texas. The plane was en route to its base when it crashed in a

residential area shortly after take-off.

He served a total of eight years in the air force, having four years of service in the continental United States followed by three years in Europe, during which he participated in the celebration "Berlin Airlift" operations.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete, pending arrival of the body.
