No license is required for salt water fishing. For fresh water fishing, the non-resident license fee is \$2.60 for a five-day permit, and \$1.10 for a daily permit.

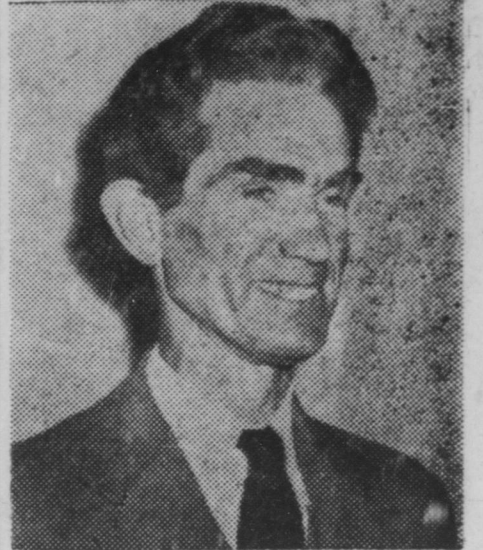
