Zebulon and community were saddened early Sunday morning at the news that Millard Wallace Chamblee had died at Rex Hospital after an illness of several months. He had long been active as a farmer and livestock dealer and had been a member of the Wake County Board of Commissioners for 13 years.

Funeral services were conducted from the Zebulon Baptist Church yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock by the Rev. Carlton Mitchell and the Rev. R. H. Herring. Business associates and Wake County officials served as pallbearers. Burial was at Montlawn.
