Ann Perry, member of the choir, discovered the smoke and flames as she entered the building and spread the alarm.

Workers had time to save only what they could move from the church before the building was completely destroyed.

The Zebulon Fire Department was called to help, but it was 45 minutes before the pumping equipment could be put into use. The water was pumped from Massey's Pond, located some distance behind the church.

At least ten more men are needed by the field artillery unit to bring it up to its strength goal.

Maximum range for FM stations is 150 miles, according to Ralph Talton, Zebulon office manager. With the antenna mounted on top of the water tank, transmission is so good that the estimated range of the local station will be 140 miles.

The radio communication between the office and the repair trucks prevents the linemen from having to return to Zebulon between jobs: and in case of emergency repairs being needed, the repair trucks can be notified immediately.
