Town Ordinance

On motion of Commissioner Howard Beck, seconded by Commissioner Phillip Massey, the following ordinance was introduced:

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REMOVAL OF NOXIOUS WEEDS, VINES, BRIERS OR GRASS REQUIRED

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF ZEBULON:

If any person shall fail, refuse or neglect to cut, destroy, or remove such growth of noxious weeds, vines, briers or grass within ten days after notice to do so, given by the Chief of Police of the Town of Zebulon, North Carolina, then the said Town of Zebulon and its agents and employees may enter upon such lot or premises and cut and destroy said noxious weeds, vines, briers or grass, and the cost and expense thereof shall be paid by the owner, lessee, occupant, or agent, or it shall become a lien against said property the same as taxes, and the collection of the same may be enforced in the same manner as the enforcement of the collection of taxes.

This ordinance will be in full force and effect after it has been published one time in the Zebulon Record, a newspaper published in the Town of Zebulon, North Carolina.

Town Ordinance

On motion of Commissioner Howard Beck, seconded by Commissioner Philip Massey, the following ordinance was introduced:

AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT THE GROWTH OF WEEDS,

VINES, BRIERS OR GRASS, ON ANY LOT, VACANT LOT OR GOUNDS IN THE TOWN OF ZEBULON, NORTH CAROLINA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF ZEBULON:

Any owner, lessee, or any agent, servant, representative, or employee of any owner, lessee, or occupant, having control of any lot, vacant lot or ground situated in the Town of Zebulon, North Carolina, who shall allow, permit or maintain on any such lot any growth of noxious weeds, vines, briers or grass to a height of eight

inches or more which may be dangerous or prejudicial to the public health or which may constitute a public nuisance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

This ordinance was passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Zebulon, North Carolina, on Monday, August 6th, 1951.

This ordinance will be in full force and effect after it has been published one time in the Zebulon Record, a newspaper published in the Town of Zebulon North Carolina.
