Recreation Pledge By Rebel Party Wins Big Victory

The Rebel Party, promising a recreation center for Zebulon, swept into power at Wakelon School on Tuesday, capturing all seven offices at stake from the opposing Confederate Party. Led by party chairman Jimmy Joyner, who polled 89 votes in winning the post of mayor, the Rebels placed their candidates in all six of the Commissioner posts.

A total of 143 ballots were cast in the spirited election, which climaxed two weeks of intensive campaigning and a party primary conducted the previous week.

Local Youth Day

Mayor Worth Hinton congratulated the winners in the election. He set aside Wednesday, April 16, as Youth Day in Zebulon. On this day the newly elected Wake mayor and commissioners will take over all town offices and run the municipal government.

Posts which will be filled by the youth city government will be Chief of Police, Night Policeman, office clerk, fire chief, and Judge of Recorder's Court.

The youth commissioners are Leroy Trevathan, who led the ticket with 100 votes, Elton Chamblee, 93; Betty Lou Bunn, 85; Glenn Perry, 84; Jean Robertson, 84; and Billy Massey, 69.

Kat Baker, unsucessful Confederate candidate for mayor, was given 54 votes in the election.

The Confederate candates for commissioner were Artelia Bailey with 66 votes; Billy Hugh Bunn, 59; Jean Richardson, 57; Wayne Massey, 62; Joyce Bunn, 52; and Ann Strickland, 52.
