

Rents to Be Determined By Tenants' Income; Three Towns Included

At a mass meeting held in the Municipal Building on Friday night, citizens of Zebulon petitioned the Board of Commissioners to complete steps necessary to qualify Zebulon for low-rent units sponsored by the Public Housing Administration, a Federal Agency.

The mass meeting was called by the Commissioners when a petition signed by 25 citizens was presented the group two weeks ago.

Speaking at the meeting were LeRoy Clark, Jr., of Wendell, who has spearheaded a drive to obtain the housing units for the Zebulon-Wendell-Wake Forest areas, and E. H. Moser, secretary of the

No Opposition

Rent on the low-cost units is determined by the income of the tenants, Clark explained. The administration of the units is left entirely in the hands of a three-man local housing committee which will be appointed by the governing bodies of the area served. In the case of this area, the towns of Wendell, Wake Forest, and Zebulon will appoint one member each.

Applications for the units must be in the Richmond office of the Public Housing Authority by July The training given reserves 1 for early action, Clark continued. He emphasized the need for haste on the part of the three towns.

A survey will be conducted to determine the needs of this area. The number of units required will be determined by the number of families in the low-income group, which was classified as families earning \$2,400 or less each year.
