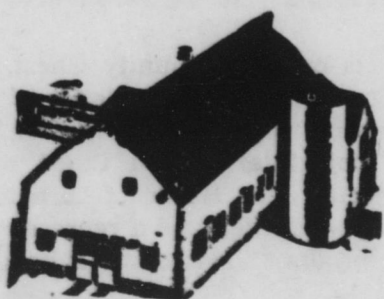

Miss Geraldine Hood has taken a position at Rex Hospital as secretary for Miss Cheek, head nurse.

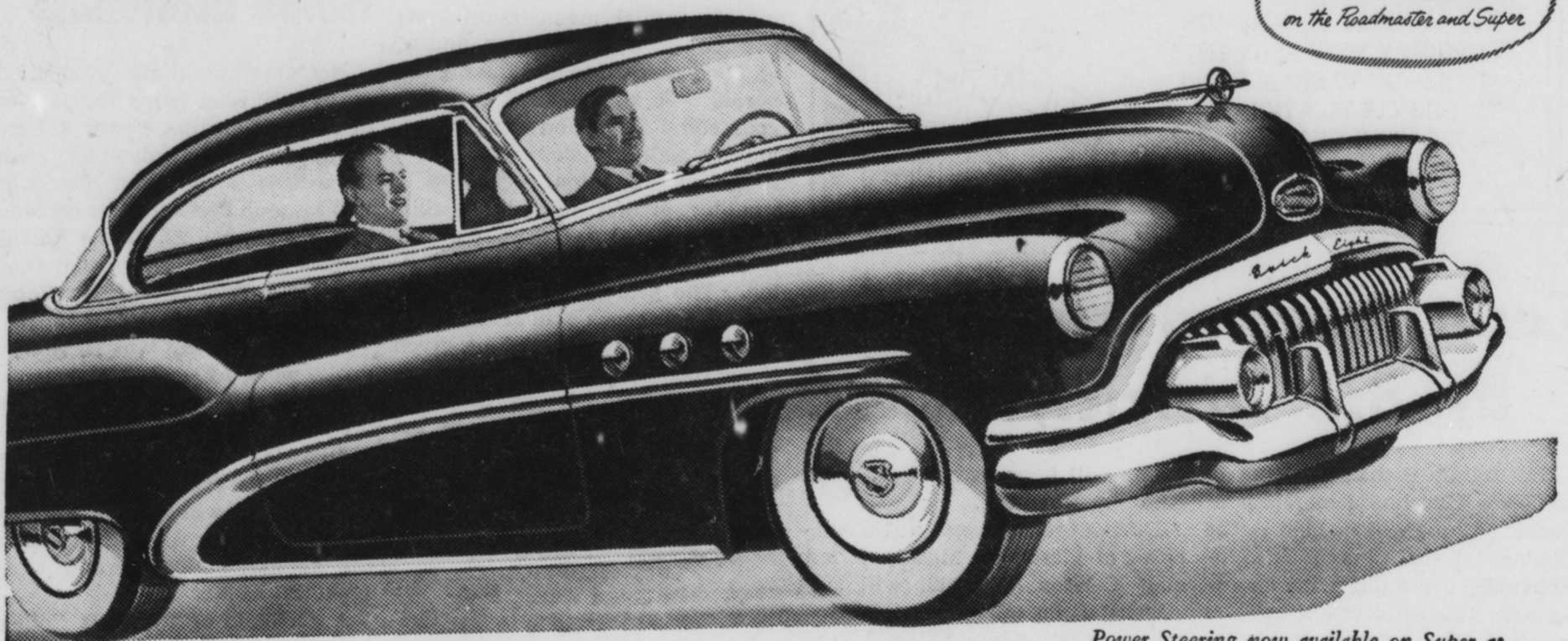
Miss Willow Bolton is working at the Educational Building in Raleigh.
