When farming practices ordinarily followed today are used, North Carolina farms lose about one inch of topsoil every 15 years, Billy Knott told members of the Zebulon Farm Bureau last Monday night. The average depth of topsoil is only seven inches, he said, and unless progressive farming methods are adopted, the nation will soon find itself hungry be cause the devastated land will not grow sufficient food to feed a growing population.
