

### **Necessary Steps**

Board members outlined the necessary organizational steps as follows: (1) Invite interested agencies to join United Fund. (2.) Present to the member agencies a tentative budget and negotiate amounts which seem unfair. (3.) Conduct the single drive with full cooperation of all groups and with publicity of an educational nature which would prevent member agencies' "losing their identity." (4.) Allow no other solicitations in the community by taking any steps deemed advisable under the individual circumstances.

Chairman Debnam stressed the fact that schools and churches are not included in the United Fund and will continue to conduct drives on a purely local basis for their projects.
