Rain, Wind, Hail

Rain, wind, and hail storms struck communities around Zebulon twice this week, damaging crops on Tuesday and Wednesday night. A severe storm Tuesday night brought both hail and wind damage to areas to the north and south of Zebulon, and a second storm Wednesday night brought slight hail.

Tuesday night's wind broke large limbs from trees and lifted the roof off a farm building near Rolesville. The hail accompanying the wind and rain devastated some tobacco fields to the north and east and did damage in the Corinth sec-

Areas not hurt by the wind and hail benefited greatly from the rain, however, because the ground was fast drying during the extended hot weather and crops were beginning to suffer.

The motion to adopt the League schedule was made by Commissioner Wesley Liles, seconded by Commissioner Howard Beck, and carried unanimously by the Board.
