Mrs. Vera Rhodes visited her mother, Mrs. Alice Hood, Tuesday night.

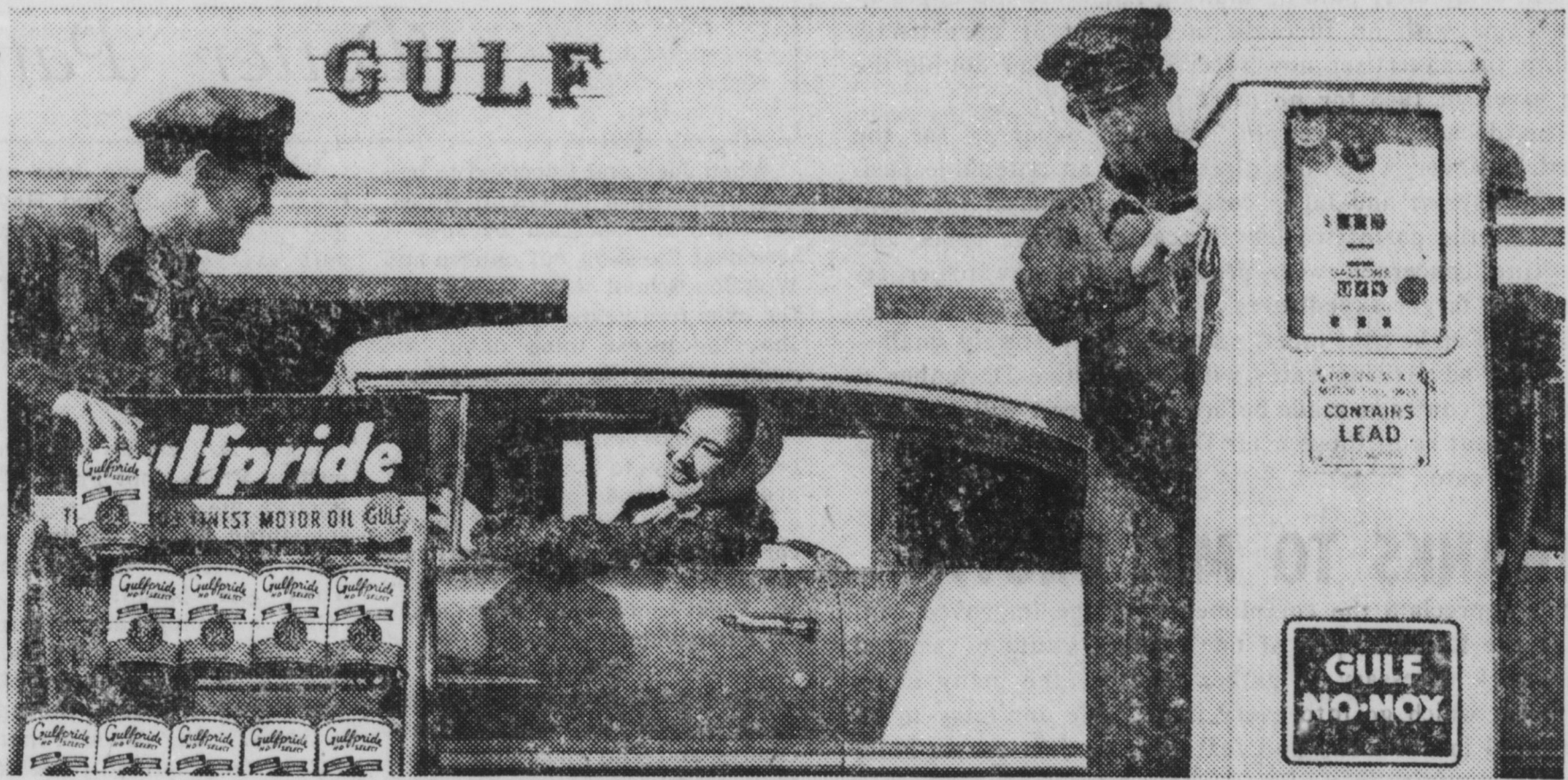
Mrs. Vera Rhodes and Mrs. Edgar Liles attended the circus in Raleigh Monday afternoon.
