VACCINATIONS

TYPHOID FEVER AND DIPHTHERIA

1956

THIS IS IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ

Our records show that 85 to 90 percent of the eight to nine thousand persons vaccinated against typhoid fever each year TAKE ONLY ONE DOSE - booster dose. ONLY ONE VISIT will be made to each dispensary point unless otherwise indicated.

Persons who have been vaccinated within three years, should take one dose (booster). If a person has never been vaccinated or if not within three years should take three doses.

The dispensary places visited three times will make it possible for all who need three injections to get them. Infants and young children who need two doses of *Diphtheria, Whooping Cough, and Tetanus* should get them on the first and third visits.
