

#### **Unusually Heavy Vote is Counted**

The residents of Little River-Zebulon Township endorsed the Pearsall Plan Saturday which would make it possible to close individual schools and use State funds for tuition in private schools by a vote of 10 to 1.

Voters in Zebulon and Little River cast 650 ballots for the plan and 71 against.

Officials said that this vote was light in view of regular referendums, but rather heavy for a special election.

In other precincts of the county Little River-Mitchell's Mill vote was 169 in favor and 14 against. Mark's Creek-Wendell, 445 for and 103 against; Wake Forest-Rolesville, 240 for and 34 against; and Mark's Creek-Eagle Rock, 233 for and 23 against.
