## Pre-School Clinic To Be Monday

The pre-school clinic for Wakelon School will be held Monday morning, April 15, it has been announced by Principal John Hicks.

Mr. Hicks pointed out that it will be necessary for every pre-school child and one of his parents to be present at this clinic and registration. The state law says that before a child may be permitted to a school he must register.

The Wakelon principal urges parents of pre-school children who are eligible for admission to the school during the coming fall to take their children to their family physician for a complete check-up, provided this has not been done six months prior to the date of the pre-school clinic. Moreover, he urges parents to have the family physician immunize the children for diphtheria, whooping cough and smallpox. These immunization shots may be received at the Zebulon Municipal Building during each week, given by the county nurse.

When the physical examination and immunization have been done by the family physician, it will not be necessary to have this service rendered by the health department. However, the parent must present at the registration the certificate of examination by the physician as well as certificates showing the immunization for diphtheria, whooping cough and smallpox.

Parents must present the birth certificate of the pre-school child. Monday in Raleigh.


