

Dr. B. Elmo Scoggin Guest Minister For Revival at Pilot Church

Dr. B. Elmo Scoggin, professor of Old Testament, Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, will be guest minister for revival services at Pilot Baptist Church, March 24-30.

The services will be held each evening at 7:30 p.m. with the closing service Sunday, March 30, at 11:00 a.m.

Dr. Scoggin received his A.B. degree from Furman University, and his Th.M. and Th.D. degrees from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville.

From 1942 to 1949 Dr. Scoggin served as pastor in Kentucky and Florida. Dr. Scoggin went to Israel in 1949 as a missionary and returned to the States in 1955 when he became guest professor of missions at Southeastern Seminary. He became Professor of Old Testament at Southeastern Seminary in 1956.

Dr. and Mrs. Scoggin, who before her marriage was Miss Hannah Pearlman of Charleston, S. C., have one daughter, Scarlett.
