Auto Victim

Roy Weathers Killed Sunday

Roy C. Weathers, 46, died at Rex Hospital Sunday night about 12 o'clock from injuries suffered in an automobile accident on U. S. 64 Sunday about 8:30 o'clock.

Highway Patrolman B. K. Tucker reported that Weathers was traveling west on U.S. 64 at an excessive speed. About 400 feet from old Pearl Harbor juke joint on the S-curve Weathers' car ran off the left side of the road, then back across the highway onto the right side, turning over one and one-half times.

The 1956 Ford driven by Weathers was a total loss, according to the patrolman.

Weathers was not thrown from his car but was found hanging by a foot from the door, Patrolman Tucker said witnesses told him.
