Diane was born on January 5, 1949, about four miles south of Zebulon. At the age of two years she was displaying her rare talent. When she was four she was singing number one hit songs as fast as they appeared on radio. At this time, she was also appearing on amateur contests throughout the State.

In 21 contests, Diane won 18 first places. In many cases she was competing against college students and still came out on top.

In 1957, when she was eight years old, she won a contest that gave her and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Wilson Bailey, a free trip to the Grand Ole Opera in Nashville, Tenn. While there she appeared on the Junior Grand Ole Opera. Many of the top recording and singing stars on the Grand Ole Opera said, "All this child needs is a chance and she will go places."

Diane is in the sixth grade at Corinth-Holders School.
