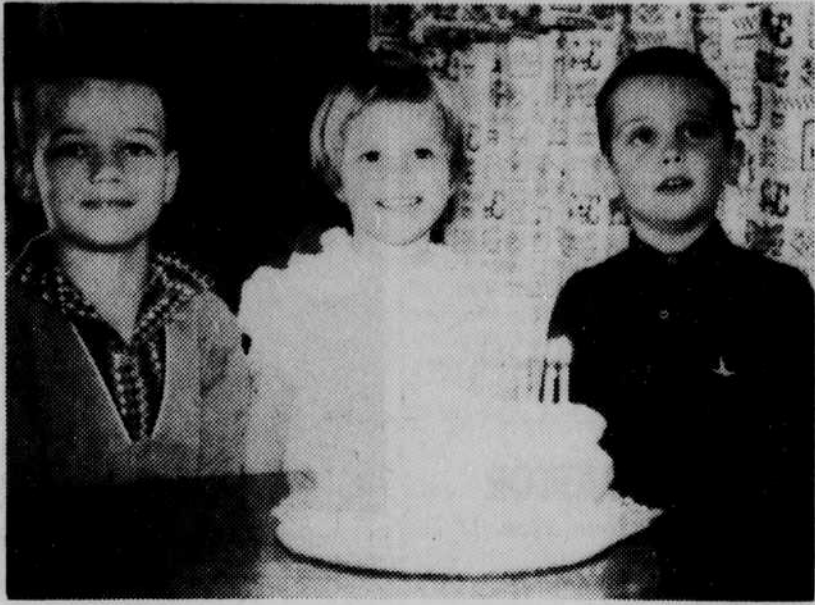
Leaves The Air

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DIRECTIONS:
Do not mix the contents of this package with any other material but apply to the plant with a dust gun or thru a coarse mesh sack just as it comes from the package. For an average dusting about three 4 lb. packages are required for one acre. If a liquid spray is desired add one quart of Blue Dragon Dust to four gallons of water. Stir well and spray with a good liquid spray gun which will force the dust on the under side of the leaves.

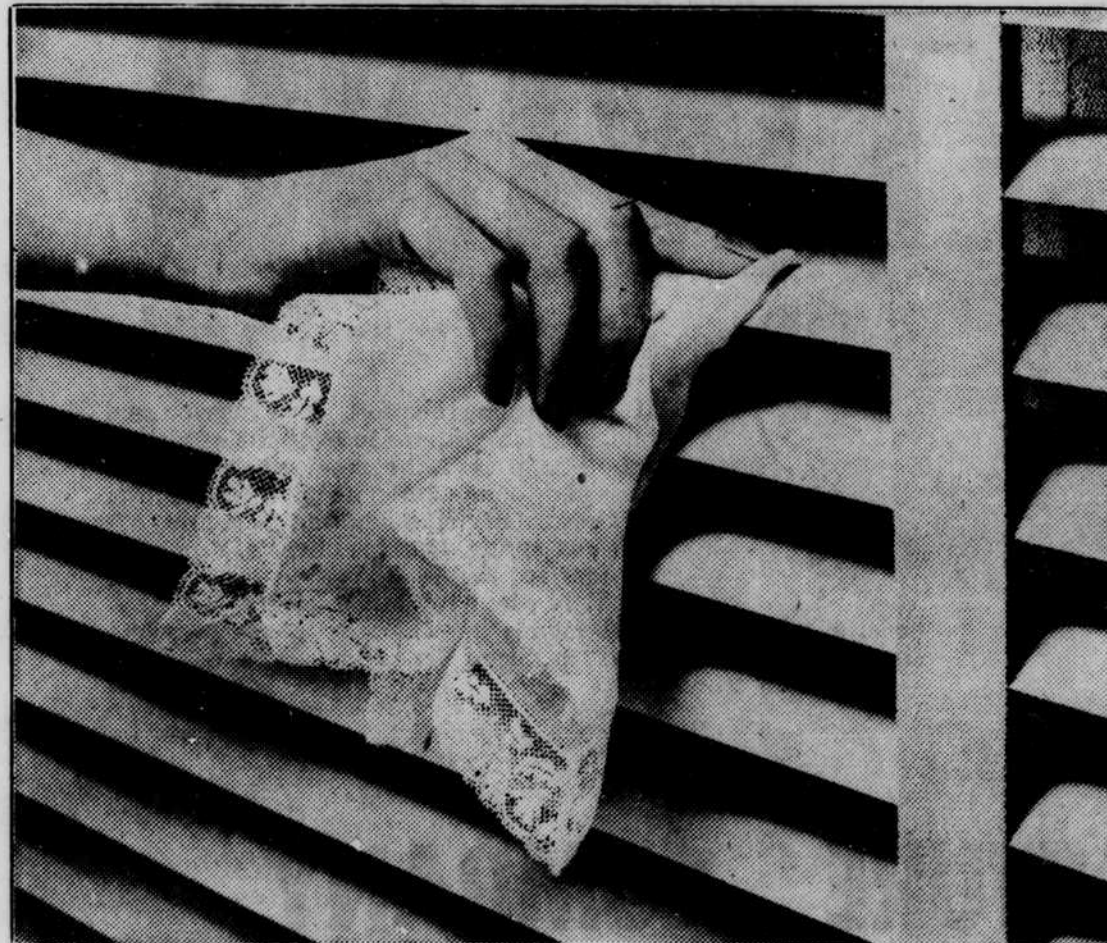
