The nuptials were said before an altar of arrangements of white flowers and seven branched candelabra.

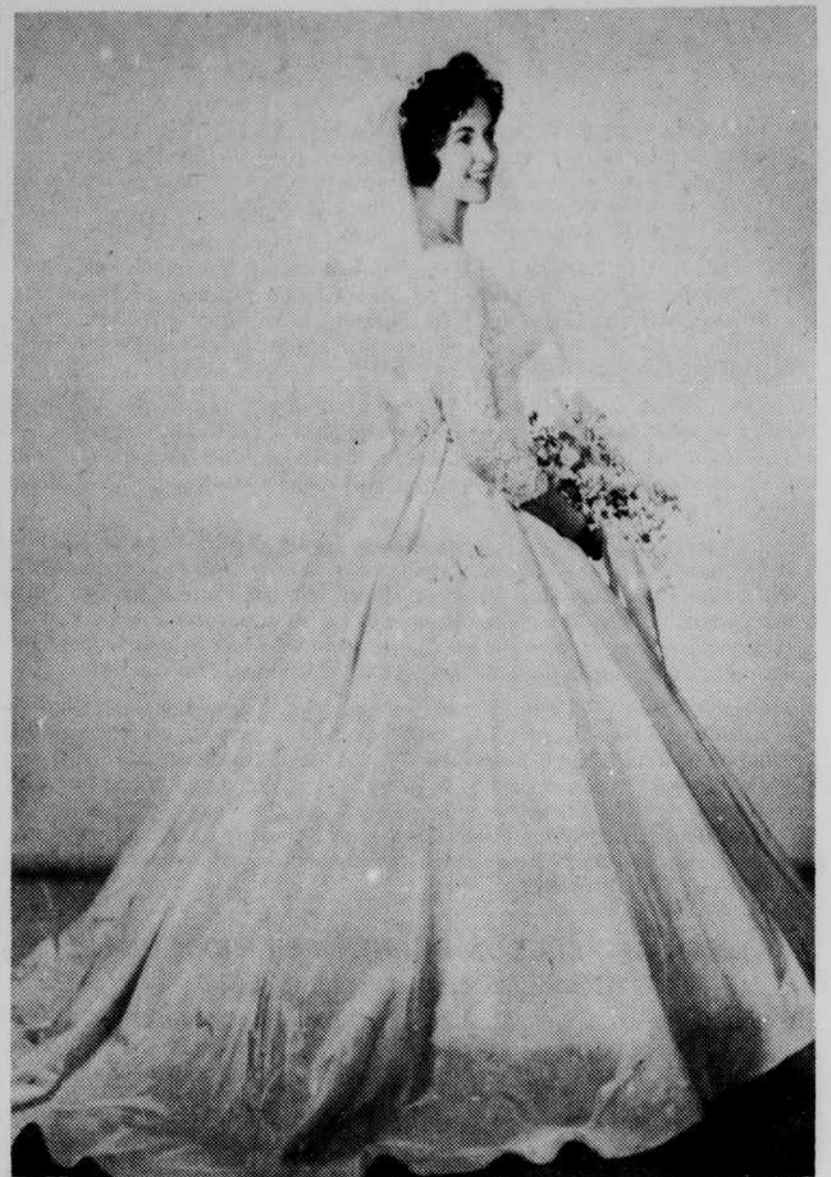
