NOTICE OF CONSIDERATION OF AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE TOWN OF ZEBULON

The public will take notice that on the second day of October, 1961, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. at the Zebulon Municipal Building the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Zebulon will at its regular monthly meeting consider the adoption of an ordinance annexing to the Town of Zebulon the territory described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the intersection of Judd Street and Arendell Avenue and runs thence north with the east side of Arendell Avenue North 23 degrees 40 minutes West 650 feet; runs thence North 85 degrees 45 minutes West across N. C. Highway 96 to a point in the west side of the right-of-way of said highway; runs thence with said right-of-way North 23 degrees 40 minutes West to a point along a course of South 66 degrees 40 minutes West from the intersection of the Tippet line with the east side of the right-of-way of N. C. Highway 96; runs thence North northeasterly with Tippet's line 310 feet to a point; runs thence South 23 degrees 40 minutes East to the present boundary of the Town of Zebulon; runs thence northwesterly with said boundary to a corner; runs thence with said boundary South 23 degrees 40 minutes East to the north side of Judd Street; runs thence South 66 degrees 40 minutes West 150 feet to the point of beginning.

In accordance with the General Statutes of North Carolina, Chapter 160, Article 36, the public is further advised that the Board of Commissioners is required to submit the question of the proposed annexation to a vote of the people in the area proposed to be annexed if at its meeting on October 2, 1961, the said Board of Commissioners receives a petition of 15 per cent of the qualified voters resident in the area proposed to be annexed requesting that an election be held on the proposed extension of the corporate limits.

The public is further advised that if the Board receives a petition signed by 15 per cent of the qualified voters residing in the Town of Zebulon who actively participated in the last gubernatorial election requesting that the question of annexation be submitted to them for a vote also, the Board then will be required to conduct the election in the municipality and in the area proposed to be annexed.
