batteries such as Zebulon has. He then became a Staff Sergeant E7, the grade he holds today.

During all his service with the National Guard, Sgt. Arnold has maintained 100 per cent attendance, never missing a drill nor any trip or duty required by the Guard. He has been present for every roll call—a most unusual record for even the most dedicated Guardsman.

His activity in the Guard doesn't keep him from filling an important role in the civic and church life of his community. A member of Zebulon Baptist Church and Sunday School, he has served as Senior and Junior Deacon, chairman of the Junior Board for two years, Sunday School teacher for eight years, member of the Building and Property Committee for 15 years, Associate Superintendent of the Young Adult Department for two years, church custodian for a year, is now secretary of the Sunday School and one of two male soloists featured with the Baptist choir.

He finds time for work with the Lions Club, which he serves as first vice president. Previously he has been secretary, second vice president, and chairman of the Blind Sight Committee.

The American Legion had a profitable year when he was commander, and for several years he served the veterans' organization as adjutant.

He is active in the Wakelon School Boosters' Club, and for a year worked as secretary-treasurer of this group.

The energetic Guardsman is happily married to the former Dare Clark. They were wed March 14, 1952, less than two months before the new groom volunteered for World War II. The Arnolds have two beautiful daughters: Sue, 15; and Nancy, 8.

"Nobody," says Sgt. Arnold, "has more work to do than an Administrative-Supply Technician. It's the most diversified work available, so an AST must be able to do everything in a unit a little.

"To keep even with the work," he continued, "urgent matters have to be completed first. Then concentrate on the work that remains."

Sgt. Arnold devotes the same careful attention to his administrative work that he did to vehicles and other equipment when he was caretaker. Only one morning report has required an initialed correction in all his years at work, and that was for a misnumbered page. For the past four years all Battery A payrolls have been perfectly prepared—a fete equivalent to a ballplayer batting 1.000 and hitting 70 homeruns in a season.

With men of Sgt. Arnold's caliber playing such important parts in church, school, and civic life, it is clear why the National Guard has its roots sunk deep in American communities.

Power Off Sunday On REA and CP&L Lines

Electric Power will be cut off from all members of Wake Electric Membership Corporation for four hours, from 3 a.m. to 7 a.m., Sunday, November 19, by the wholesale power supplier, Carolina Power and Light Company, to cut in a new section of transmission line between Milburnie and Zebulon.

Carolina Power & Light Company crews will be up before dawn on Sunday, November 19, working on a high-voltage transmission line from the company's Milburnie substation near Raleigh to Zebulon.

F. T. Scarborough, manager for CP&L in Zebulon, said the early morning hours, from 3 to 7 a.m., will give workmen time to complete one phase of a six-month project to boost the power reserve in the region.
