Plans are underway to modernize some of the town's street lighting.

At the December board meeting, Commissioners Elizabeth Ellett and Pat Farmer were appointed to confer with Carolina Power and Light Company officials about the project.

Town Manager Willie B. Hopkins said some of the streets in the residential areas have old outmoded street lights. He said plans are to enlarge the lighting fixtures and replace the old type lamps with new ones

Hopkins said that this modernization of the street lights has been needed for a long time.

The board acted on a resolution to encourage property owners with vacant lots to have them cleaned and beautified.

Hopkins said there are lots in the town which are unkept and WSOC Channel 9 in Charlotte Dec. eye sores. These vacant lots are over-grown with weeds and are filled with debris and junk. Many of these places, he continued, have become junk heaps.

"It is embarrassing for out-oftown people to see how junk-ridden and unsightly some of the vacant lots are. And we urge that property owners of such lots see that they are cleaned up immediately. If not, the town will clean them and charge it to the property owner."
