Bo was second place winner in the botany-biological division of the National Science Fair held in Seattle, Washington. His project was The Effect of Irradiation on Black Shank Fungus.

Governor Terry Sanford praised the high school youth and his teacher, Mrs. Elwood Perry.

The Governor said what is important in quality education is providing a means and place where young people can seek excellence. Excellence is something for which we must forever strive."

"This business of quality education is to seek excellence," Sanford continued. "It is designed to achieve excellence and to develop the kind of men and women who can provide leadership for tomor-

Sanford declared there is no more important profession in the nation and no greater need than the teaching profession.

"What she (Mrs. Perry) has done is to literally touch the lives of hundreds of boys and girls," Sanford said.

The Governor defended his food tax legislation passed by the 1961 Legislature.
